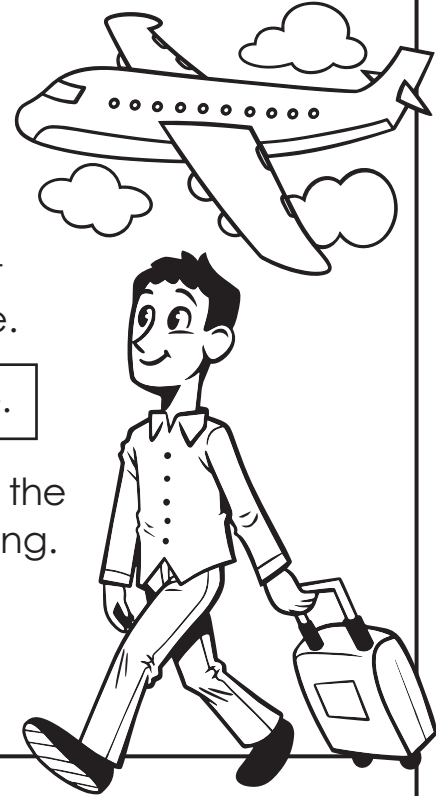
Subordinating conjunctions join together clauses of different importance. One clause adds information to another clause.

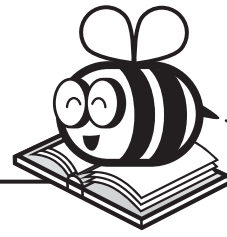

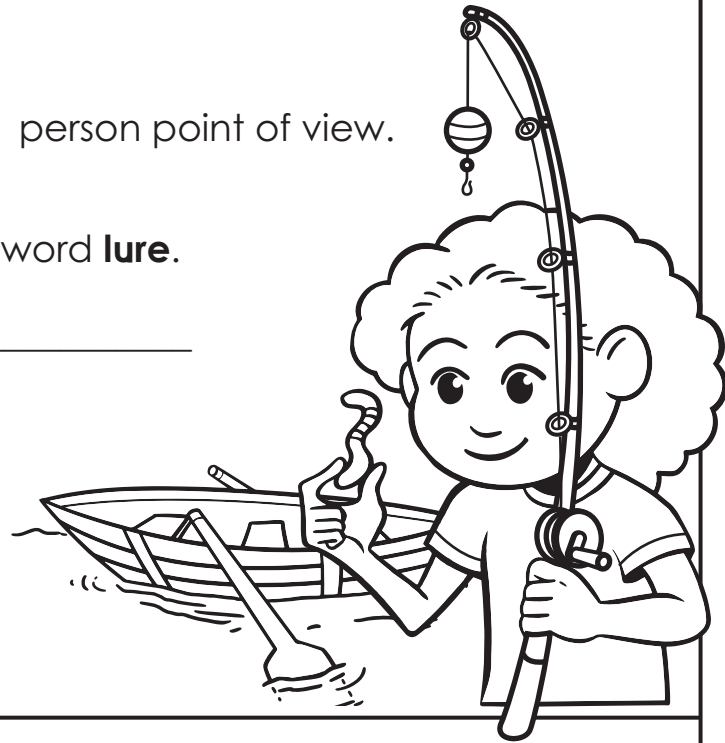
