## Easter Possessive Nouns



**Possessive nouns** show who or what owns something.

Singular nouns (one person or thing) are made possessive by adding an apostrophe and then an s.

**example:** the basket that belongs to the boy

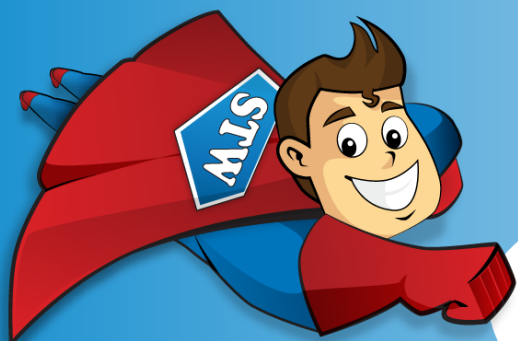
**the boy's basket**

Plural nouns (more than one person or thing) are made possessive by adding an apostrophe after the s.

**example:** the basket that belongs to two girls

**the girls' basket**

When a plural noun does not end with an s, an apostrophe and then an s are

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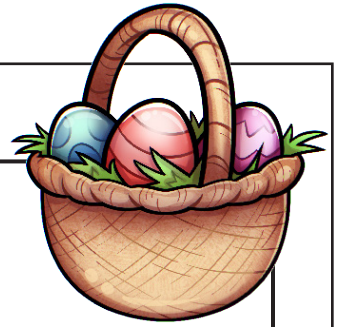
