Homographs are pairs of words that have the same spelling, but have different meanings.

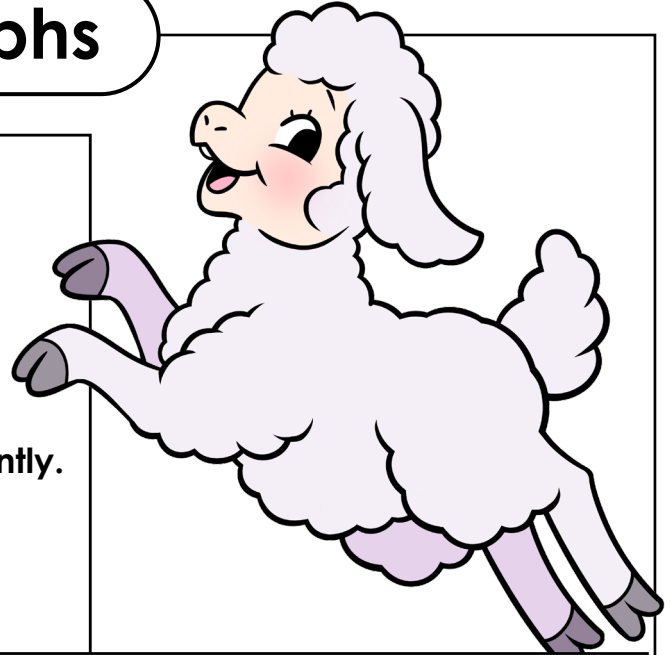
The farmer made a pen for his sheep.

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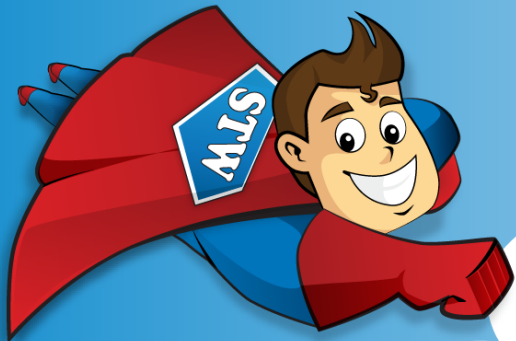
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
