

Counting Money Matching Game

British Coins

Objective:

This game is played like the memory match card game that many children are familiar with. It is designed to reinforce their understanding of counting money.

Materials:

Word and picture cards (pages 2-4)

Set up:

Copy the cards on card stock.

Cut the cards on the dotted lines.

How to play:

There are many ways to use these cards. Here are two possibilities.

1. You may have students simply match the amounts with the correct picture amounts. Have them count the coins as they do this.
2. Use the cards to play a memory-match game with 2 or more students. Flip the cards upside down. Students take turns flipping pairs of cards in an attempt to find a matching pair. Pairs of matching cards are kept by the player. The student with the most cards at the end of the game is the winner.
