# Word-Picture Match

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#### **Objective:**

Students practice reading words that end with a silent e.

#### Materials:

Word and picture cards (pages 2-4)

## Set up:

Copy the cards on card stock. Cut the cards on the dotted lines.


### How to play:


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There are many ways to use these cards. Here are three possibilities.


- 1. You may have students simply match the words and pictures. Have them spell and read the words as they do this.
- 2. Use the cards to play a memory-match game with 2 or more students. Flip the cards upside down. Students take turns flipping pairs of cards in an attempt to find a matching pair. Pairs of matching cards are kept by the player. The student with the most cards at the end of the game is the winner.
- 3. You may also want to use just the picture cards. Have the students spell the names of the items shown on paper or plastic letters.



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
