Formatting Titles

In addition to correct capitalization, you must use correct formatting when writing about the title of a work. What is correct depends on two things.

1. Typing vs. Handwriting

Quotation marks are clear whether typed or handwritten. Titles that go in quotation marks are always punctuated the same way.

Italics are often only clear when typed. Titles that are italicized when typed should be underlined when written by hand.



Works that are short or only make up pieces of larger works are put in quotation marks. Think of them as light enough to only need hooks to hold them up, like a pair of double quotation marks.
