

The Colosseum

You've likely seen people dressing up on Halloween or TV with armor and swords to look like gladiators. Have you ever seen pictures of the place real gladiators fought? It's big, round, full of arches, and old.



Colossal means huge—and the Colosseum really is big. It's still the largest building of its kind! It used to have two walls. Most of what's left is the inside wall. The outside wall stands 4 stories and 157 feet (48 meters) tall. It was about 615 feet long by 510 feet wide (189 meters by 156 meters) in an oval shape. In the middle is an arena that's 287 feet by 180 feet (87) meters by 55 meters). The Colosseum fit more than 50,000 people—some say up to 80,000!

Remember all those arches? They're entrances! The Colosseum has 80 entrances in all. Most visitors used 76 of them. People performing in the

events used two. The last two were special. They were only

used by the Roman emperor and his party.

The Colosseum was a gift from the emperor to the people of Rome. Most of its biggest events were free. But that didn't

mean you could sit anywhere you wanted. The richer and more important you were,

the lower you sat.

The Colosseum had much more than gladiator fights. There were staged hunts of wild animals from around the world. There were plays and shows. For the first few years, they even flooded the arena for swimming

horses and small boat battles!
The flooding likely stopped when they finished building. It might have damaged the underground place built to keep, raise, and lower animals and people.

Gladiator fights stopped sometime in the 400s. The Colosseum was last used for shows sometime in the late 500s.

Then, for almost 1,200 years, the Colosseum was used for many different things. These included a graveyard, a place to set up shops, and a castle during war. Earthquakes and fires caused lots of damage. So did people taking stones and iron to build new things.

It wasn't until 1749 that people decided to protect the Colosseum. We still do today. From 2013-2016, more than \$19 million was spent cleaning up nearly 2,000 years of dirt. Now, more than 4 million people visit and enjoy this amazing building every year.




