
All the rivers and bodies of water made the land good for farming. Land good for farming is called fertile. The rivers also flooded each year. Floods left behind rich soil the area made good crops. Wheat, barley, protein-filled chickpeas, and tasty figs were good to eat. They were also easier to grow than many plants. Animals good for farming, like pigs, sheep, and goats, lived there too. Desert cats also lived there. They helped keep mice and rats away.

All these factors together meant that farming started early in the Fertile Crescent. There are signs of domestication from around 11,000 years ago! Once people got

the hang of farming, they began making cities. That's why places like Jericho date that far back too. That's also why the Fertile Crescent is sometimes called the "cradle of civilization." Just like a baby's cradle, it saw the birth of the first civilizations.

Today, the Fertile Crescent is drier than it used to be. There are also many more people living there. Places like Egypt and Mesopotamia used to have a few million people at most. Those were huge numbers at the time! Now the numbers are in the tens and hundreds of millions total. That makes using the limited water in the area trickier. Modern farming and trade are needed to keep making the Not-so-Fertile Crescent a good place to live.


